We are pleased to extend an invitation to you and your spouse or companion to attend the 2012 Convention of the National Association of Pipe Coating Applicators to be held April 18-22, 2012 at The Westin La Paloma Resort & Spa, Tucson, Arizona. All delegates are encouraged to bring their spouses to the convention, and most people do. The remainder of this letter and enclosures will provide you detailed information regarding the convention, business program, and social events. As addressed below in detail, **the deadline for making your hotel reservations is March 15, 2012. The deadline for registering for the convention through NAPCA is April 3, 2012.**

2012 CONVENTION PROGRAM

All details regarding the convention are set forth in the enclosed convention packet and at the NAPCA website. Included in this packet you will find a Convention Program, NAPCA Convention Registration Form, Information Sheet for Spouse Events and Tucson Restaurants and, for NAPCA Members only, a Hall of Fame Nomination Form.

This year's business program will present many timely issues critical to the plant pipe coating industry and those of its service and materials suppliers. Our keynote speaker on Thursday, April 19 will be Robert Jones, Vice President of Keystone Pipelines, TransCanada Corporation, Calgary, Alberta, Canada. He will provide an "Update on the Keystone XL Pipeline Project." Mr. Jones will be followed by Dr. Chris Alexander, Principal, Stress Engineering Services, Inc., Houston, Texas. In an effort to provide engaging speakers that also bring technical expertise to our conventions, Dr. Alexander will address an issue central to the business of our members, which is "Stress Cracking of Coatings and Pipeline Integrity Issues." In the past, we also had two top-quality speakers on the second day of the convention. However, to eliminate the inevitable early departures of many general session attendees anxious to begin preparations for the NAPCA Golf Tournament, we have elected to modify this practice. Instead of two speakers, Cameron Gingrich, B.Sc., B.A., Senior Manager, Gas Services, Ziff Energy, Calgary Alberta, Canada, will make an extended one and a half hour presentation that all attendees should find fascinating and timely given the current economic climate. His topic will be "Future Dynamics of the Oil and Gas Markets." Few topics apply as directly to the businesses of our delegates and we are pleased that Mr. Gingrich has agreed to attend our convention to provide a detailed view of what to expect in future years. Following Mr. Gingrich's presentation all attendees will have more than ample time to prepare for the Golf Tournament and we hope that all of you will stay for the entirety of the presentation.

LINE PIPE MANUFACTURERS CLOSED MEETING AND BREAKOUT SESSIONS

In addition to the general session presentations, there will be an extended Line Pipe Manufacturers Closed Meeting on Wednesday, April 18, beginning at 2:00 pm. At our last meeting the members of this group established a more definite structure for their group with certain goals and expectations. This meeting will continue until all pertinent issues and discussions are completed. If you are a representative of a line pipe manufacturing company and have a topic you would like to address or submit to the group for discussion at the meeting please let me know via my e-mail address (mchastain@gardere.com). As we get closer to the convention we will post the proposed topics on the NAPCA website.

There also will be breakouts for the various coatings, including Liquids, Water and Sewer Pipe, Fusion Bonded Epoxy, and Coal Tar on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, as identified in the enclosed convention schedule. In an attempt to make each of these sessions more substantive and productive, the topics that will be addressed at the breakout sessions also will be posted on the NAPCA website as we approach the convention so that all attendees will have an opportunity to consider the topics before the actual meetings.

NETWORKING EVENTS AND ENTERTAINMENT

Breakfasts, lunches and all afternoon and evening activities are geared for spouse participation. The first evening event will be the President's Reception for all in attendance which will give everyone an opportunity to renew old friendships and make new acquaintances. CONVENTION REGISTRATION

The convention registration fee is \$500.00 for each delegate and \$350.00 for each spouse or other companion. However, to encourage retirees from the pipe coating industry to attend the convention the Board of Trustees has reduced the convention registration fee for retiree delegates to \$150.00 and for spouses or guests of retiree delegates to \$100.00, a saving per couple of \$600.00. NAPCA does not have mailing addresses for most retirees. We request that each member company contact its retirees who might be interested in taking advantage of the reduced convention registration fees and refer them to the NAPCA website for the convention package or forward the convention package to them. **The deadline to register for the convention is April 3, 2012.** We encourage all delegates to **register on-line at the NAPCA website www.napca.com** by clicking on "Conventions and Workshops". All delegates and spouses from your company can be registered for the convention on-line at one time. You may also charge the convention registrations on any major credit card. However, for those who do not wish to register on-line, you may complete and return the enclosed Convention Registration Form with appropriate fees to our office no later than April 3, 2012. However, should you choose not to make your hotel reservation on-line, you may make your reservation by telephone with Westin La Paloma reservations at (800) 937-8461 ensuring to tell them you are part of the National Association of Pipe Coating Applicators so that you can get our group rate. **The important thing to remember is that you must make your room reservation no later than March 15, 2012 to ensure you will have a room.** The resort will be quite busy in April, and, if you miss the deadline, you cannot be assured of having a room.
